

Scrappy Church

- · Chapter 1 focused on hope.
- Chapter 2 introduced the three parts of a Turnaround Cycle Outward Deluge, Welcome Readiness and Backdoor Closure.
- · Chapter 3 focused on Outward Deluge.
- Chapter 4 focused on Welcome Readiness
- Chapter 5 focused on closing the back door (how to retain visitors and members)

This past week the group discussed Chapter 6 – The Next Scrappy Church, which was a summary of the book. It also gave some guidelines of how to move forward as a Scrappy Church.

Some discussion points and ideas that came from this are:

- One of the biggest challenges of becoming a scrappy church is attitude. We won't change unless we see the need to change.
 - Becoming a scrappy church does not happen overnight. It can be a 3–5-year process with 2 steps forward and 1 step back during that time
 - Discussed revisiting our vision statement and using that to set goals in order to accomplish changes
 - A common thing among successful scrappy churches is that they love their church unconditionally
- Outward deluge is not a seasonal thing. It needs to be a steady and heavy outpouring. Scrappy churches find a way to have ongoing outward efforts.
- Discussed what welcome readiness might look like with changes made to the church building to be more inviting, especially to younger adults.
- Backdoor closure ideas included rejuvenating small groups and having small groups/ programs in place for visitors and members to be involved in. People like to feel connected to other people and to feel they have a purpose in the church.
- Now that the group has finished the book, discussed what the next steps might look like for First to be a Scrappy Church
